CHURCH TOWER UPDATE

I wrote in the 23rd June 2024 Newsletter that that was my last report as Chair of the Tower Project Team. However, there are two items which I thought needed to be covered in an update. The first is good news, the second less so but manageable.

On October 1st, St Mary's Church was given a national architectural award for the recent tower refurbishment work. This was awarded, by the London based Georgian Group, for the best restoration of a church in the country. In its citation, it says that the renovation work was needed following stone falls in 2021, which covered stone replacement using lime mortar, the refurbishment of the clock faces, the repainting of the heraldic shields and the refurbishment of the finials and weathervanes. It also mentions the work of the church architect, Mark Stewart, and the building contractor, Ackroyd Construction.

Clare Gould and I collected the award certificate in a ceremony in London. Unfortunately, Mark Stewart, the real star of the show, had covid and was unable to attend. I think it is fair to say

that we sat waiting for the results announcement more in hope than expectation but were both surprised and delighted when the name St Mary's Church, Warwick was read out.

That is the good news. The not so good news is that the clock has stopped working. The main project covered the removal of the four clock dials and hands for restoration offsite, along with the overhaul of the dialworks. The view taken at the time was that the separate clock mechanism would not need any major work. Sadly, this has not turned out to be the case. The carillon and time bells still work but not the basic clock. The clock manufacturer has now been asked for a quote to refurbish the clock and, separately, a quote to bi-pass the clock with an electronic clock either as a temporary or permanent solution. Angus and the PCC will have to consider how any cost can be afforded. John Edwards 21/10/24

In other parts of the Church every attempt is made not to show faces, but this can happen if people turn around during the service. The congregation is not filmed whilst receiving communion.
