The Red Chair Project involves reserving an empty chair at a public place with a sign in red highlighting facts about domestic violence. The empty chair will also serve as a visual symbol of the lives lost to gender-based violence. The colour red reminds us all of the violence faced by millions of women in war zones, on city streets, and also in their own homes. As Karen Morris, the Mothers' Union Diocesan President says, 'this is a simple way to relay a powerful message about domestic abuse', and is designed to encourage conversation about a very difficult subject.

The south side of St Mary's (by the font) is a zone for those who wish to maintain social distance or avoid the cameras from our livestreaming. In other parts of the Church every attempt is made not to show faces, but this can happen if people turn around during the service. The congregation is not filmed whilst receiving communion.
